

ALPS Clean Energy ETF

Monthly Insights | March 2021

Key Takeaways

- The ALPS Clean Energy ETF (ACES) fell -3.99% in March 2021 as last month's selloff on interest rate and valuation uncertainty continued into the final month of the quarter.
- Efficiency/LED/Smart Grid was the best performing segment, with two names gaining over 11%.
- Acuity Brands Inc. (**AYI; 5.53% weight***), an Efficiency/LED/Smart Grid name, was the top performer in ACES, +33.82% after posting strong earnings on the final day of the month.

Performance

- The ALPS Clean Energy ETF (ACES) fell -3.99% in March 2021, but outpaced the WilderHill Clean Energy Index (ECO) by 4.94% due in part to its pure allocation to only U.S. and Canada-based companies. ECO's allocation to Asia Pacific clean energy companies hindered performance in March as several growth companies in China sold off disproportionately on rising global interest rates and potential Chinese government interventions.
- On the last day in March President Biden announced a \$2 trillion infrastructure plan which includes numerous incentives for clean energy. The plan includes \$174bn for electric vehicles spread across charging infrastructure (500K charging stations by 2030), an expanded EV tax credit, and programs to spur investment in domestic EV supply chain manufacturing and sales. Tax credits to support wind and solar would be extended by 10 years under the proposal, and would be expanded to allow for direct payments while including energy storage and other emerging clean technologies like hydrogen. While the proposal would need to be passed into law by Congress, the focus on clean energy is notable.



Attribution

- Efficiency/LED/Smart Grid was ACES best performing segment, +5.06% in March. Fuel Cell was the laggard, down -20.18% with Plug Power (**PLUG; 4.25% weight***) dragging the segment down after announcing a need to restate their financials, although it was mentioned it won't impact their operations.
- Efficiency/LED/Smart Grid finished as one of the two segments in the green in March with Acuity Brands Inc. (**AYI; 5.53% weight***) providing much of the positive return. Acuity Brands soared 33.82% after posting earnings that beat expectations on higher margins from cost efficiency improvements.
- TPI Composites (**TPIC; 1.87% weight***) was the best performer in the Wind Segment in March. The composite wind blade manufacturer had an excellent month that saw a +18.40% return and announced plans to become carbon neutral by 2030.

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Valuation

- ACES's underlying index, the CIBC Atlas Clean Energy Index, has a price-to-earnings ratio (P/E ratio) of 43.19x and a price-to-cash flow ratio of 15.16x.
- ACES ~30% weight to utilities is within more expensive Yieldco's, which garner higher P/E's but lower P/CF (Price to Cash flow) metrics.



Company: **Aemetis Inc.**
(AMTX; 0.39% weight*)



Segment:
Biomass/Biofuel

- Aemetis is a biotech company specializing in biochemical and biofuels industries, based in California.
- Aemetis was added to ACES on March 19th in the quarterly rebalance amid a news laden month:
 1. The month started with the announcement of a new 5 year expansion plan which includes an anticipated \$1 billion in revenues by 2025 (a 35% compound annual growth rate).
 2. Reported favorable earnings mid-month that excited investors and led to several analyst price target increases as well as newly initiated BUY recommendations.
 3. Late in the month, the company benefited from the California Air Resources Board certifying use of a new fuel pathway, using dairy biogas.
 4. A new 32-mile biogas pipeline extension in California and a new biodiesel deal from their India subsidiary also highlighted a great month for the company.
- Aemetis gained 150% in March and 23.46% since its addition to the fund.

Clean Energy Sector Risk. Obsolescence of existing technology, short product cycles, falling prices and profits, competition from new market entrants and general economic conditions can significantly affect companies in the clean energy sector. In addition, intense competition and legislation resulting in more strict government regulations and enforcement policies and specific expenditures for cleanup efforts can significantly affect this sector. Price/Earnings Ratio - A valuation ratio of a company's current share price compared to its per-share earnings.

Price/Cash Flow Ratio - This represents the weighted average of the price/cash-flow ratios of the stocks in a portfolio. Price/cash-flow represents the amount an investor is willing to pay for a dollar generated from a particular company's operations.
